EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Each and every year, I am touched by the positive stories about children and adults who participate in our family support initiatives. From the middle school student who played the leading role in our theatre performance of Little Women, to the culinary arts workforce training graduate who was offered a position at Uno Chicago Grill, I am inspired by the heart-felt work and compassion of so many people, working to beat the odds for at-risk kids and families in Woonsocket.

This annual report presents highlights of our communitybased work over the past year. In 2013, we were thrilled to receive grant awards from several new funders to support critically important programs and services. Just to touch on a few: The Red Sox Foundation funded our Parents As Teachers Program, which provides parenting education and promotes school readiness for our youngest children. CVS Caremark awarded a community grant to CCF, which allowed us to offer Fit and Fun, an after-school health and nutrition program for special education high school students.

We also launched the "Beacon of Hope" Campaign, a major fundraising effort to purchase the historic Hope Street School (our current headquarters). Anchored in the heart of the Fairmount/Constitution Hill neighborhood, **CCF** hopes to be a resource to families for years to come. Many community-minded corporations, foundations, banks, and individuals have stepped forward to support this exciting endeavor and we are so grateful for everyone's commitment.

Already, 2014 promises to be a tremendous year for CCF. Recently, we learned that the United Way Women's Leadership Council has funded CCF to support after-school and summer STEM Programming (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) for middle school students. Also, with the announcement of a second year of funding from the RI Governor's Workforce Development Board, we will expand and enhance our culinary arts job training program. 2013 Initiatives

YEAR AT A GLANCE

- Served more than 3.000 children and families in Woonsocket.
- Offered 29 parenting workshops for teen mothers.
- Obtained a mini grant from Rhode Island.
- Provided after-school and summer enrichment programs for 1,768 students in grades K-12.
- Increased after-school enrichment at Coleman Elementary School by offering 13 additional programs, primarily focused on science, technology, engineering, and math.
- Assisted 1670 individuals with emergency basic needs, including food, rental and heating assistance, clothing, and baby formula.
- Offered free tax preparation services for 441 tax filers through our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA), totaling \$1,057,379 in federal tax refunds to low-to-moderate income families.
- Launched a workforce training program for unemployed adults looking to gain bookkeeping and accounting skills for entry level positions in the financial services industry.
- Raised over \$15,000 from CCF's 3rd Annual Make Tracks for Kids 5K Race/Walk held at Bryant University.


LOOKING AHEAD

- Continue the "Beacon of Hope" Capital Campaign to purchase the historic Hope Street School, allowing CCF to achieve its mission in the city of Woonsocket.
