MEMBERSHIP/PROGRAM FEE:

- A one-year CCF membership fee of \$15 per family and a \$5 activity fee per 8-week cycle/per child are required to participate in Kids' Adventure Program. **All CCF members must renew annually.** Paid CCF members of our 2018 summer camp, Chillin' & Skillin' are paid through August 2019.
- No student/family will be turned away if they cannot pay. Scholarships are available upon request. Please ask Rebecca Davila for a scholarship form.

PROGRAM:

- At school dismissal, students will come to the cafeteria for homework club. In addition, students will receive a dinner and participate in fun learning centers. At 3:30pm, students will be dismissed to enrichment programs.
- **From 3:30-5:00pm, students will be in enrichment program. With the exception of emergencies, students should not be picked up early unless Kids' Adventure staff has already been notified by a note or phone call.**
- **Dismissal is from 5:30pm- 6:00pm. Please do not be late. There will be a fee for excessive lateness.** Dismissal is at the front entrance of Citizens. **Please bring a valid photo ID in order to sign out your child.**
- **Only those listed on the pickup list will be allowed to dismiss students. Please notify Kids' Adventure staff of any changes made to your child's registration form.**

REGISTRATION:

- All students participate in Homework Club Monday-Thursday before and after the enrichment classes. All students **MUST** do homework or read during that time.
- Please return your registration form and payment to the school's main office or CCF office at Citizens.
- Programs fill up fast, so please indicate a second choice on each day. Late registration forms are always accepted if there are spots available in a program. Programs are going to be limited to 15 participants, so please return your registration forms in a timely manner.
- On Fridays, we are offering limited programming. We will be enrolling on a first come, first served basis.

Program Descriptions:

Homework Help (Monday –Thursday) - Students will be participating in homework help for 45 minutes daily. School day teachers, program staff and college students will be available to students who need help.

Roger Williams Park Zoo (Monday) - Students in this program will be able to see and learn about different animals from the Zoo each week.

Engineering (Thursday) – In this program students will be able to improve more on math skills, problem solving, literacy and critical thinking skills all while building different projects.

Program Descriptions:

Rhythm Room (Monday) – In this program, students will learn how to use different instruments to create music.

Glee Club (Thursday) - This club is like Chorus but with a twist. If you like singing and dancing this is the right program for you.

Young Leaders (Tuesday) – This program is focused on giving our students a voice and what it means to take on responsible leadership roles.
