**MEMBERSHIP/PROGRAM FEE:**

- A one-year CCF membership fee of \$15 per family and a \$5 activity fee per 8-week cycle/per child are required to participate in Kids' Adventure Program. **All CCF members must renew annually.** Paid CCF members of our 2018 summer camp, Chillin' & Skillin' are paid through August 2019.
- No student/family will be turned away if they cannot pay. Scholarships are available upon request. Please ask Rebecca Davila for a scholarship form.

**PROGRAM:**

- At school dismissal, students will be escorted to the library. Students will receive a dinner, participate in fun learning centers and receive help with homework. Afterwards, students will be escorted to their enrichment programs.
- **From 3:30-5:00pm. students will be in enrichment program. With the exception of emergencies, students should not be picked up early unless Kids' Adventure staff has already been notified by a note or phone call.**
- **Dismissal is from 5:30pm- 6:00pm. Please do not be late. There will be a fee for excessive lateness.** Dismissal is at the front entrance of Pothier. **Please bring a valid photo ID in order to sign out your child.**
- **Only those listed on the pickup list will be allowed to dismiss students. Please notify Kids' Adventure staff of any changes made to your child's registration form.**

**REGISTRATION:**

- All students participate in Homework Club Monday-Thursday before and after the enrichment classes. All students **MUST** do homework or read during that time.
- Please return your registration form and payment to the school's main office or CCF office at Pothier.
- Programs fill up fast, so please indicate a second choice on each day. Late registration forms are always accepted if there are spots available in a program. Programs are limited to 15 participants, so please return your registration forms in a timely manner.
- On Fridays, we are offering limited programming. We will be enrolling on a first come, first served basis.

## Program Descriptions:

**Homework Help (Monday –Thursday)** - Students will be participating in homework help for 45 minutes daily. School day teachers, program staff and college students will be available to students who need help.

**Animals in their Environment (Monday)** – Students in this program will be able to see and learn about different animals in their environment each week.

**Arts and Crafts (Thursday)** – In this program, students will be making seasonal crafts along with projects they can take home.

**Books Alive (Monday)** - In this program, students will be reading different books and using critical thinking skills by doing projects based on the books they have read.

**Coding (Thursday)** – This program is all about computer programming. Students will work with each other on iPads to program robots to move and do different tasks.

**Cooperative Games (Tuesday)** – In this program, students will participate in fun team building activities and learn how to play different board games.

**Dance (Wednesday)** – Do you have Rhythm in your feet? This program will allow students to practice self-expression with music and be able to learn dance moves.

**Dare to Dream (Thursday)** - In this program, students will explore possibilities for their future by creating projects that express their hopes and dreams and learn about different careers when they grow up.
