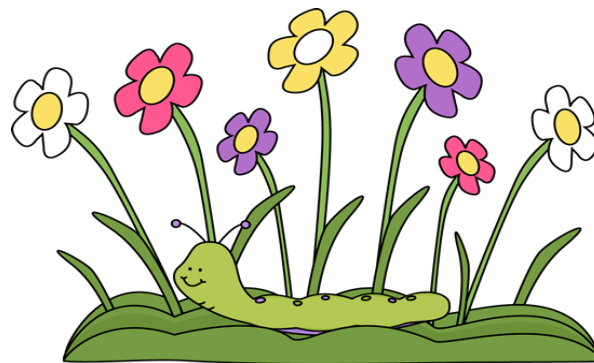

Welcome to the 2019 Spring Cycle of the 21st CCLC After School Program at WHS! **The Winter Cycle begins on Monday, March 18th and runs for 8 weeks.**

HOW DO I SIGN UP?

- Registration booklets are available at the main office, the guidance offices, and the CCF office on the upper level of the library.

WHERE DO I BRING MY REGISTRATION FORM?

- Complete the registration form, have a parent/guardian sign it and return it with the fee to the CCF office on the upper level of the library or leave it in the CCF mailbox in the main office. **Very important: Once you have signed up for a session, please be sure to honor that commitment by attending each week it meets.**

IS IT FREE?

- There is an annual membership fee of \$15.00 per family for the year and then only the \$5.00 activity fee per each cycle due at the start of each 8-week session. If you have already paid a membership fee this year, then it is just the \$5.00 activity fee. Cash or check payable to: Connecting for Children & Families (CCF). **No student will be turned away if they cannot pay. Please ask for a scholarship form in the CCF office on the upper level of the library.**

WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

- Besides having access to lots of different clubs and activities for three 8 week cycles throughout the year, **you will be eligible to participate in all the field trips and activities we offer during vacation weeks and throughout the year.** Also —if you attend all 8 weeks of the programs you sign up for, you will receive a certificate of completion which you may use for your Portfolio at the End of Year Celebration.
