HOW DO I SIGN UP?

WHERE DO I BRING MY REGISTRATION FORM?

- Complete the registration form, have a parent/guardian sign it and return it with the fee to the CCF office on the upper level of the library or leave it in the CCF mailbox in the main office. **Very important: Once you have signed up for a session, please be sure to honor that commitment by attending each week it meets.**

IS IT FREE?

- There is an annual membership fee of \$15.00 per family for the year and then only the \$5.00 activity fee per each student due at the start of each 8-week session. If you have already paid a membership fee this year, then it is just the \$5.00 activity fee. Cash or check payable to: Connecting for Children & Families (CCF). **No student will be turned away if they cannot pay. Please ask for a scholarship form in the CCF office on the upper level of the library.**
