Welcome to the SPRING 2020 WMS 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC After-school Program Session!

★ Spring 2020 Session begins on Monday, March 16th and ends on Friday, May 15th. Programs are offered Monday - Friday from 2:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m. At dismissal, Hamlet and Villa Nova students report to the Villa Nova Cafeteria. Students enter by the back door, check in with program staff, get a dinner and participate in games and activities until 2:30 p.m. At 2:30 p.m., program instructors pick up their students and escort them to their room.

★ After-school program dismissal is at 4:30 p.m. at the main entrance of Villa Nova. Parents/guardians must pick up their children **no later than 4:45 p.m.** Please let Ms. Travis know by 2:00 p.m. if there are any messages for a student about transportation or walking home on a given day. **For early dismissal**, students must provide a note from their parent/guardian to after-school program staff, or parents will be called to verify early dismissal.

★ Cell Phone Use - Students may use their cell phones while in the cafeteria before programs begin to call or check in with their parents/guardians. Students are not allowed to use cell phones during program time unless it is part of a lesson. **Please do not call or text your child while programs are in session unless it is an emergency.**

★ Announcements are made in both buildings for program cancellations. IF A PROGRAM IS CANCELLED, STUDENTS MAY JOIN ANOTHER PROGRAM.

★ A CCF Family Membership Fee of \$15.00 is required to participate in the after-school program. The membership fee is valid for **one year** and can be used for students in the same family participating in 21<sup>st</sup> CCLC after-school programs at Woonsocket Middle School, Woonsocket High School, Coleman, Citizens and Pothier Elementary Schools. **There is also a \$5.00 Program Fee for each student** due at the beginning of the Fall, Winter and Spring 8-week sessions. With the \$5.00 fee, students may participate in programs five days a week. Cash or check payable to: Connecting for Children and Families (CCF).

★ No student/family will be turned away if they cannot pay. Scholarships are available upon request. Please contact 401-767-4848 for a scholarship form.

★ Return registration form and fee in an envelope with the student name and homeroom/building on it. **Return it to the Main Office at Hamlet or Villa Nova by Monday, March 16, 2020.** Programs fill up quickly since space is limited. Late registrations are accepted. You may choose a 1<sup>st</sup> choice program and a 2<sup>nd</sup> choice program for each day. If students do not make it into their 1<sup>st</sup> choice program, they will be enrolled in their 2<sup>nd</sup> choice program. **WE DO NOT SEND PROGRAM CONFIRMATIONS. YOU WILL ONLY BE NOTIFIED IF BOTH PROGRAM CHOICES ARE FULL ON A GIVEN DAY.**
